


Scrum origins

 - Initial scrums at Easel Corp in 1993
 - IDX and 500+ people doing Scrum
- Ken Schwaber
 - ADM
 - Scrum presented at OOPSLA 95 with Sutherland
 - Author of three books on Scrum
- Mike Beedle
 - Scrum patterns in PLOPD4
- Ken Schwaber and Mike Cohn
- Co-founded Scrum Alliance in 2002, initially within the Agile Alliance





Scrum in 100 words

- Scrum is an agile process that allows us to focus on delivering the highest business value in the shortest time.
- It allows us to rapidly and repeatedly inspect actual working software (every two weeks to one month).
- The business sets the priorities. Teams self-organize to determine the best way to deliver the highest priority features.
- Every two weeks to a month anyone can see real working software and decide to release it as is or continue to enhance it for another sprint.








Certification

- Must take an in-person 2 day CSM course from a Certified Scrum Trainer (CST) or Endorsed Scrum Trainer (EST)
- Online exam Passing is at least 24 out of 35 multiple choice questions correct
- CSM currently good for 2 years. End of 2 years, \$100. Will change. Year 3 will need Scrum Education Units (SEUs).
 You earn 16 SEUs for the course.
